NEW DAY DAWNS

Today we hear how Jonah, sent by God to warn the people. storms through the streets of Nineveh, scaring the citizens out of their wits. And it works! God has a change of

heart, seeing "by their actions" how the people turn from (Jonah 3:10). new day dawns. 

Statement of Faith - Kelly D



I was born into a non-religious, military family. I was never baptized, nor did I receive any religious education. Sadly, I do not recall ever being inside a church, with my parents, other than for weddings. Both my parents had been baptized as small children but were not raised as regular churchgoers.

At the age of 19, I had a brief first marriage that lasted about 18 months, and through that marriage I had my first child, Joey. Having a child so young will either make you grow up rapidly or run rapidly away. I did the former and my then husband did the latter!

I began my rather long journey toward Catholicism at age 24 when I married my husband, Jeff, a lifelong Catholic. We had my first marriage annulled and were married by a Catholic priest in 1984. Jeff adopted Joey six months after our wedding and we had him baptized and raised as a Catholic. Several years later we added two more children to our family whom we also baptized and raised as Catholics. All this time I was attending church services on and off through the years with my family. I thought I was doing my part by taking them to CCD and giving them an introduction to God and the religious education that I didn't receive as a child. Jeff would occasionally ask if I would ever be interested in becoming a Catholic, and my

answer was always, "NO." Why? I'm not sure. Maybe embarrassment over my lack of knowledge of the Catholic faith. Whatever my excuse, I guess I wasn't ready to receive Christ into my heart, which is odd because it's what I really wanted for my children, knowledge of God. I worried about their salvation but not my own!

As the years ticked by, our children grew up and moved away, yet my husband still attended mass (at this point often alone). I'm not sure why, but about two years ago I decided I would join him and started attending mass on a regular basis. As I attended, I started to really listen to the readings. After mass, I would pepper my husband with questions! About a year later, I approached Jeff and told him I was very interested in learning more and wanted to attend RCIA. He asked me if I was really sure that was what I wanted. My answer this time was, "YES!" After all these years of non-commitment, I was now sure that I wanted to learn more about the Catholic faith.

My time spent in RCIA has been enlightening. Truthfully it has awakened my heart to receive the Holy Spirit, something that I was not aware I was thirsting for, for so long. After attending RCIA, I now feel that I have found where I need to be. Mass and all its traditions are my new comfort zone.

I'm not done learning. There is so much I still do not know. But what I do know is that I now lean into learning and not away from learning about the Church.
