FALSE PROPHETS, TRUE PROPHETS

In Deuteronomy today we hear that God's very words will fill the mouth of a true prophet, but a false prophet will, in a manner of speaking, put mere mortal words into God's mouth. In Mark's Gospel, we see Jesus teaching and healing as a true prophet, one filled with the

authority of God's own voice, the Holy One of God. The whole history of our church is filled with both true and false prophets. But in today's Gospel we learn that Jesus' fame spread because he taught with authority; he wasn't an authority because he was popular or famous. We also learn from him, in his desert temptation confrontations with Satan, that anyone can quote scripture, even against God's purposes. And today we hear that his authority was not like that of the scribes, who held the official positions of religious authority in his day. Our work is to do our best to discern the true prophets in our midst, and to be true prophets as well. The psalmist tells us how to do this: by not hardening our hearts when God speaks. If we truly listen to God, it will be God's very words filling our mouths.

Third Order Regular: Franciscan Rule and Life Chapter IV: The Life of Chastity for the Sake of the Kingdom

14. Let the brothers and the sisters keep in mind how great a dignity the Lord God has given them because He created them and formed them in the image of His beloved Son according to the flesh and in His own likeness according to the Spirit. Since they are created through Christ and in Christ, they have chosen this form of life which is founded on the words and deeds of our Redeemer.

15. Professing chastity for the sake of the kingdom of heaven, they are to care for the things of the Lord and they have nothing else to do except to follow the will of the Lord and to please Him. In all of their works the love of God and all people should shine forth.

16. They are to remember that they have been called by a special gift of grace to manifest in their lives that wonderful mystery by which the Church is joined to Christ her spouse.

17. Let the brothers and sisters keep the example of the Blessed Virgin Mary, the Mother of God and of our Lord Jesus Christ, ever before their eyes. Let them do this according to the exhortation of St. Francis who held Holy Mary, Lady and Queen, in highest veneration since she is the virgin made church. Let them also remember that the immaculate Virgin Mary, whose example they are to follow, called herself the handmaid of the Lord.







Statement of Faith - Joshua W



Faith and a Christ-centered life has always been part of my identity. I grew up in a home where knowing Jesus and having a personal relationship was encouraged. My parents were both heavily involved in our local Baptist church and I was involved with every children's pageant, youth retreat, usher ministry and children's choir activity you could think of. As I grew older, I began to question, "How is God real to me?" There was never a doubt that he was real, but I had to admit I hadn't explicitly heard his voice or felt his touch and it challenged the authenticity of my beliefs for a while. However, through my life I've begun to see God in unique ways and found his word to be an anchor to my soul. When I was in high school, I took a hermeneutics and exegesis class (understanding how to interpret the bible) with my church youth group. This class helped me deepen my scholar understanding of doctrine and influenced my choosing a Christian school for

undergrad. However, I still had moments of doubt and wanting more "realness" of God. Attending Abilene Christian University was a great experience for meeting others who grew up in various faith backgrounds and who saw and felt things like I did. It helped foster a more devotional understanding of the Holy Spirit in my life. During college, I worked as a camp counselor for Pine Cove Christian camps and began to experience Christ's nearness in a unique way. I will never forget the moment of feeling an overwhelming peace while sitting out on the camp deck watching the sunset just in awe of creation. It would be the first of many times God would bring me back towards him

through his creation. Psalms 19:1 says, "The heavens declare the glory of God; the skies proclaim the work of his hands." While in college and onward, I was dating my now wife, Sarah, who grew up in the Catholic faith. I had always found the reverence for the sacraments and early Church history inspiring and fascinating but my upbringing in Protestant traditions made me question some of the tenets of the Catholic faith. But in my time getting to know Sarah and her family, I saw far more similarities between Catholic teachings and my understanding of being a Christ follower. As we attended Mass together and shared our reflections about following Jesus' example, the word "joy" became a recurring theme prompted by the Holy Spirit. 1 Thessalonians 5:16-18 reads: "Rejoice always. Pray continuously, give thanks in all situations. For this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you." This verse has changed my life in many ways and has helped draw me back to God, even in my seasons of doubt. Working in the healthcare field, there have been several moments where God's presence is harder to recognize. However, when He did speak into our situations, He spoke with so much clarity that our only response was to trust God above all things.

As I come into full communion with the Catholic church, I recognize that I have so much to learn and be grateful for in pursuing Christ. How amazing is His grace to use us as imperfect as we are to be part of His story, and to be made in His image. The reality of who God is to me is celebrated with the sacraments of the Church but also is in seeing and hearing the stories of His people around the world. This journey thus far has shown that faith is not a passive process. It looks different for everyone but in all situations, God is the same.




