Weekly Reflection

Fourth Sunday in Lent | March 14



GOD'S MERCY
Today's reading from
the second book of
Chronicles contains
a sort of
"mini-history" of
Israel. It highlights
God's mercies in
choosing Cyrus the
Persian to be an
instrument of

deliverance when the people were in captivity in Babylon. Despite their sinfulness and the deserved punishment they were undergoing, God's mercy was lavished on the people in the form of a miraculous act of liberation. The Letter to the Ephesians, in much more theological terms, gives a similar account of a God "who brought us to life with Christ—by grace you have been saved." The author stresses that it was when we were "dead in our transgressions" that God saved us, an act of pure grace. He emphasizes that it is not our own efforts that freed us from sin ("this is not from you"); rather, "it is the gift of God." This, of course, is the heart of the entire Pauline corpus, that salvation comes to us by faith in God's revealed in the death οf Jesus. Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co.

Third Order Regular: Franciscan Rule and Life

Chapter VI: The Life of Poverty

21. All the sisters and brothers zealously follow the poverty and humility of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Though rich beyond measure (2 Cor. 8:9), he emptied himself for our sake (Phil. 2:7) and with the holy virgin, His mother, Mary, He chose poverty in this world. Let them be mindful that they should have only those goods of this world which, as the Apostle says, "Provide enough food and sufficient clothing; with these we are content." (1 Tim. 6:8). Let them particularly beware of money. And let them be happy to live among the outcast and despised, among the poor, the weak, the sick, the unwanted, the oppressed and the destitute.

22. The truly poor in spirit, following the example of the Lord, live in this world as pilgrims and strangers (Mt. 10:27-29). They neither appropriate nor defend anything as their own. So excellent is this most high poverty that it makes us heirs and rulers of the kingdom of heaven. It makes us materially poor, but rich in virtue (Jn. 2:5). Let this poverty alone be our portion because it leads to the land of the living (Ps. 141:6). Clinging completely to it let us, for the sake of Our Lord Jesus Christ, never want anything else under heaven.



Statement of Faith: Noah



Growing up I was baptized and confirmed in the United Methodist Church. I was very involved in the church and was head of the youth group for three years. I even spent three weeks in Russia as an ambassador for the church before my senior year of high school. After high school I lost my way and turned away from religion. I stopped going to church and, in hindsight, was spiritually lost. In the fall of 1998 I met my wife, Catherine, who was a cradle Catholic, during our first semester of grad school at George Washington Univ. We were married in June 2001 at a Catholic Church in Florida. During our almost 20 years of marriage, she's always picked the church's we attended. I should say, she attended. Over the years, my attendance at mass was occasionally, at best, to never, at worst. My thinking was I couldn't take communion so why go. We moved to Texas in 2014 for my job. My wife found a job as a KG teacher at the parish Catholic school, Holy Trinity, where our son Daniel was in 2nd grade and our daughter Penelope was in Pre-K. While volunteering at school, I met many great parents that were "on fire" with their faith. I was astounded at how much some of the dads knew about their faith. Once I told them I wasn't Catholic, almost all of them would ask one of two questions, "Why not?" or "Do you want to be?" My answer was almost always, "No, I plan on going to back the Methodist Church." I was still only rarely going to mass. My son eventually asked my wife why dad didn't have to go. There really wasn't a good reason. In September 2019, a good friend's mom passed away. The funeral was held at Good Shepherd. I sat with some friends from Holy Trinity. Something happened that day that had never happened before. I felt the need

to receive a blessing during communion. Since I had never done it before I didn't know what to do. I think the Eucharistic Minister actually blessed me twice. I don't know why I was moved. My only explanation is the Holy Spirit was working in me. Not long after that we joined a Small Church Community with three other families from GSCC and HTCS. I eventually told them about what happened at the funeral. Everyone also thought it was amazing and that the Holy Spirit was working on me. The next day, I received a text from one of the husbands saying it's our duty as a husband and father to get our family to heaven. It was at that moment that I decided I needed to explore joining the Catholic Church. In early 2020, I started Inquiry and eventually progressed into RCIA. During this time, my perspective and outlook on life, and the world in general, has really changed. I pray almost every morning as soon as I wake up. It's how I start my day. Thanks to Breaking Open the Word (BOW), I read the daily scriptures and reflections. I have started attending the Men's Rosary on Saturday mornings. I've read books by Fr. Jacques Philippe, Bishop Robert Barron, Matthew Kelly and Catholic converts Scott Hahn and Trent Horn. My spiritual growth and learning of the Catholic faith have been a great help in dealing with the crazy year of 2020. I would say RCIA has brought calm and peace during a very uncertain period of time. This emergence of faith in my life over the past year or so has also brought perspective. It shows that I'm not in control. We actually just discussed this in our small church group. As much as I want to be in control, I am not. As I prepare to fully enter the Catholic Church, I'm excited to receive the Holy Eucharist and continue my faith journey as I grow deeper in my understanding.



Mission Outreach Spotlight

Union Gospel Mission

UGM is more than a place to get a nutritious meal and place to sleep for the homeless. It's also a place that provides the opportunity for new beginnings through programs like the Mission Services Women's Program which help participants build the skills they need to return to the community as independent, productive members.

Below is the story of Deon - reading her story will provide a good overview of what UGM is all about.



After battling long-term drug addiction and living in her daughter's car for two years, Deon knew it was time to change her life. She had successfully completed a detox program, but was still homeless. Staff at the detox center referred her to Union Gospel Mission of Tarrant County. "I had no idea what is was going to be like," Deon recalls, "but the spirit in the building was perfect. Everybody I came in contact with were beautiful people!"

Right away, Deon immersed herself in the program. "Everything gets you back in touch with yourself. I really love Skill Building and Financial Literacy. They teach you how to do your banking and savings. I'm 53 and I thought I'd never get to learn that! To have somebody take time and teach me things is awesome."

Chapel and Bible study have also been a big part of Deon's experience at UGM-TC. "I truly believe it was God's doing that I got in here," she says. "This place has made it possible for me to be with my family again!"

Deon is working on her long-term goals, which include finding a job, buying a car, making a home for herself – and learning to love herself again. "It feels good to be sober," she admits. "I'd forgotten how it felt because I'd been in my addiction for so long. They actually saved my life. To God be the glory for all He has done, because I know He has placed these people in my life."

Last year, 2020, amid the pandemic, UGM had 696 residents in program and celebrated 173 graduates.


