Weekly Reflection

Fifth Sunday in Lent | March 21



THE NEW COVENANT
Today's first reading is an
enormously important passage,
not only in the history of the
Jewish people, but also for us
as disciples of Jesus, who see
in it a foreshadowing of the
Christian dispensation. The
prophet announces that God
has chosen to forgive the

people, and that as a sign of divine forgiveness a new covenant will be established. Contrasting the new covenant with the one made with Moses on Mount Sinai, Jeremiah says that the new covenant will be written on the people's hearts rather than on tablets of stone. No longer will the community's tradition be the sole bearer of the covenant; henceforth, God will speak directly and personally to each individual, forgiving sin and calling for a return to God in faithfulness. No longer will mere outward compliance with the dictates of the Law suffice; henceforth, God asks for an obedience that springs from the depths of one's heart.

Precisely that kind of obedience is highlighted in today's second reading, where the author of the Letter to the Hebrews describes Jesus as the mediator of the new covenant whose obedience has made him the source of salvation for all who, in turn, obey him.

Weekly Lenten Reflection

"Jesus answered and said, 'This voice did not come for my sake but for yours.'" - John 12:30

Many of us heard a new communion song at Mass over the past year. It went something like this: thunk, thunk, beep, beep. It was the sound of car doors opening and closing at parking lot Masses as people received Holy Communion. It certainly wasn't the Mass we're used to. But it is still—and always will be—the Eucharist. Throughout history, things have changed—the clothes we wear to Mass, the languages we speak there, and the songs we sing. But one thing does not change: Jesus gives himself to us—not for the sake of the Church or traditions, but for our sake. Ours. What has changed about Mass at your parish? What seems back to "normal"? More important, how has Jesus transformed you, for your own sake?





CRL Reflection for the Solemnity of the Annunciation



On March 25 we will celebrate the feast of the Solemnity of the Annunciation of the Lord.

"The whole ecclesial movement of women can and should reflect the light of Gospel revelation, according to which a woman, as the representative of the human race, was called to give her consent to the Incarnation of the Word. It is the account of the Annunciation that suggests this truth when it tells that only after the "fiat" of Mary, who consented to be the Mother of the Messiah, did 'the angel depart from her' (Lk. 1:38). The angel had completed his mission: he could bring to God humanity's "yes", spoken by Mary of Nazareth."

"In modern times, the Solemnity of the Annunciation of the Lord has taken on special meaning in Respect Life ministry. Scientific advances have allowed us to confirm that human life begins at conception. This solemnity calls us to reflect on how we are to care for, protect, and welcome new life, as the Blessed Mother did for the Christ child."
