Weekly Reflection

Palm Sunday | March 28



HOLY WEEK
For the Palm Sunday
Gospel, we return to
the Gospel according
to Mark. The account
of the Passion takes
up nearly one-third of
Mark's entire Gospel
and, of all the
evangelists, he is the
one who presents

the details most graphically. He depicts the humanity of most intensely, describing his sufferings thoroughly. Mark portrays Jesus as a complete fulfillment of the "Suffering Servant" of Isaiah, the obedient, humble slave dying on a cross of whom Paul speaks in Philippians. But it is important to remember that we call this "Holy Week" and not "sad week" or "suffering week," for each of the readings today, even the lamentations of the psalm, end in the promise of the strength and hope that is granted by God to those who faithfully give of themselves in love. As we enter into this week through these readings, we must reflect deeply on the sufferings of Jesus, but still be confident in the joy of risen, eternal life that awaits all of us who faithfully walk with him through these days.

Reminder Regarding In-Person Mass







Statement of Faith: Holly A



I grew up in the Episcopalian faith and attended an Episcopal church and school. When I reached high school, I began attending a non-denominational church as well as continuing to attend my regular church. During my time in high school I really felt close to the Lord. As I went off to college, I did not practice my faith as much but never stopped believing or praying.

After college, I met my husband, who was Catholic, and we began to attend a Catholic Church in Dallas. We then moved to Grapevine after the birth of our daughter and began attending Good Shepherd. I was happy for a while just attending church and not becoming Catholic. I felt that I was close enough being an Episcopalian that I didn't need to convert.

As our family grew, my heart started to change. There were several reasons for my change in attitude. I did not want to always tell my children to ask their father when it came to matters of the Catholic faith and I wanted to walk alongside my husband as a spiritual leader for our children.

I have a dear friend who knew that I was interested in converting and she always told me that when I was ready she would stand beside me as my sponsor. This was so encouraging to me because she was supporting me as I came to my own decision about what I wanted in my faith journey.

One of the most moving moments during my time in RCIA was during a class in which the message was that as parents it is our job to get the souls of our little ones into heaven. I have taken that message to heart and have been moved so deeply by that message. The Kingdom of Heaven is waiting for our children and us. We need to do everything in our power to get them there.

I love how this time in RCIA has opened up my heart to the Lord. I love learning new meanings of various traditions as well as real ways to study and apply them to my life. I am excited for the journey and where the Lord will lead my family and myself.
