# **Weekly Reflection**

#### Second Sunday of Easter | April 11



DOUBT The desire to be able to prove the existence of а divinity has troubled humanity human since consciousness first became aware of the divine. To this very day we are fond of saying that any number

things-from sunsets to hot fudge sundaes-are "proof that there is a God." We get so caught up in the story of "doubting Thomas" that we fail to notice that today's Gospel gives us John's account of Pentecost, the bestowing of the Holy Spirit upon the disciples following the Resurrection. Thomas, evidently, missed out not only on seeing the Risen Christ, but receiving the Holy Spirit as well. This is not to be taken lightly and, perhaps, makes Thomas' disbelief a bit easier to comprehend. It also makes his professing that Jesus is his Lord and God—the only time the New Testament explicitly refers to "God"—more Jesus Christ as remarkable.

#### Let Yourself Wrestle with God

Have you ever felt like God really wantyou to do something, but you just weren't ready for it? Mavbe it's a big change,

relationship, or a vocation, but there's something holding you back from saying yes to God's call. People may be inclined to think that this is a bad thing, and might put themselves down, saying they aren't open to God's will in their lives. But what if this back-and-forth with God is the one thing we need to really say yes? When we wrestle with God, we're not only engaging in relationship with him, but we're being truly honest with him. He desires conversation with us, and it's in wrestling with what God wants for our lives that we conform our hearts to his. We may think we know God's vocation for us, or his plan for our life, and that may scare us. But the truth is, we will never really be sure what God wants us to do until he really shows us. We can project sometimes. Right now, all he wants us to do is be his: to dedicate ourselves and our lives to him and his works, and to live every day as an opportunity to reach holiness. Don't pick a fight with God, thinking we know what he may want us to do someday. 



# Statement of Faith: Hannah Vinas



Growing up I never had solid roots at one church. We attended Sunday services very irregularly. I didn't know much about the faith that I professed to have. When I was in 2nd grade my family moved to Chicago and I started attending the Academy of the Sacred Heart. It was my first real educational experience with Christianity, and it was also my first experience with Catholicism. Part of the school's curriculum were weekly classes grounded in all things Catholic. I had a wonderful teacher who taught me so much about faith in general and was truly the person to set me on this path. When we moved home to Texas, my family really started to become religious and regular church goers. I still felt something was missing, I was just going through the motions and doubting whether I really believed in God. Then I started praying the rosary, a remnant from my Sacred Heart days. I was contemplating and reflecting on when I had last believed. I was drawn back to the Catholic faith and back to God. Over the 2019 holidays, I was visiting my great-aunt who had been raised in the Catholic Church and had attended when she was able. She hadn't said anything to convince me to join the Catholic Church, but the Holy Spirit had been working and I was moved right then and there. Roadblocks came up, but with the help of the Spirit, I overcame them and now I have come home. I have come home to spend the rest of my life in a church with the full truth of Christ, and to a community that has welcomed me with open arms.




