

# REFLECT

Our Gospel today continues Jesus' Sermon on the Plain, in which we heard Luke's version of the Beatitudes. This week, Jesus gives us new "commandments," telling us how to live and act in the world as his disciples, rooted in the radical love of God for humanity. It reminds us of his later speech about loving one another as he loves us, in other words with a God-like love, the kind we see in today's psalm about God's mercy. How else could we do as Jesus tells us by loving our enemies, which seems impossible, until we remember that God gave us the example of Jesus, who is like God but also like us? David understands this merciful love when he spares the life of his enemy in the first reading. Finally, Paul tells us that we will become like Jesus if we act as he did, as God does.

#### <u>Memorial</u>

A MEMORIAL is a day of celebration on the Church calendar. It ranks below solemnities and feasts. Some memorials are so minor that they are optional. The others are obligatory.

Memorials include the observance of saints' days in honor of Thomas Aquinas (January 28), Catherine of Siena (April29), Justin (June 1), Anthony of Padua (June 13), Benedict(July 11), Mary Magdalene (July 22), Dominic(August 8), Clare(August 11), Maximilian Kolbe (August 14), Monica (August 27), Augustine (August 28), Gregory the Great (September 3), Jerome(September 30), Therese of Lisieux (October 1), Guardian Angels (October 2), Francis of Assisi (October4), Our Lady of the Rosary (October7), Mar tin of Tours (November 11), Cecilia (November 22), and Lucy (December 13). There are many more.

If a memorial falls on a day of higher rank- a Sunday,for example-it is not observed at the liturgy that year. Falling on a weekday, however, an obligatory memorial will always be observed. Optional memorials (such as Hedwig on October 16 or John of Kanty on December23) may be celebrated or ignored.

On a memorial day, the readings at Mass are generally those of the usual weekday. Optional readings are supplied in the lectionary for each memorial, but these are not required. In some cases, when the saint of the day is mentioned in the New Testament, the reading for the memorial is obligatory. This happens, for example, with Mary Magdalene. The Collect will always be proper to the memorial. The Prayer over the Offerings, the Preface, and the Prayer after Communion may also pertain to the memorial. The priest vests in a color associated with the saint of the day, whether white or red.
