

REFLECT

OUR STRATEGIC GOAL

As a Church, we now move into Ordinary Time. "Ordinary" comes from the Latin root for "order," which is why we line the Sundays up on the calendar and count them-with "ordinal" numbers-one by one. The orderly way we proceed through the liturgical year reminds us that our faith offers a strategic goal for our lives: eternal happiness with God, who is love. Today's readings share stories of believers who order their daily activities toward the goal of sharing God's love. Isaiah embraces his role as God's servant and works to bring glory not only to Israel, but to the entire world. In a similar way, Saint Paul identifies himself as Christ's witness in the world and reminds the Corinthians of their life goal: "to be holy." The Gospel shows us John the Baptist, servant and witness, attentive to God's loving orders, the divine plan for salvation.

PONDER

Calendars

Perhaps you noticed that this year we didn't celebrate the Baptism of the Lord on the Sunday after Epiphany (today), but instead on last Monday, the day after Epiphany. Why the shift? It all has to do with regional calendars. Within certain general boundaries, every national conference of bishops is able to set its own liturgical calendar according to how it is felt to benefit the people in that region most. So, for example, the Epiphany of the Lord is celebrated January 6 on the Church's universal calendar. But the bishops of the United States decided that, for the benefit of the faithful, it would be better for Epiphany to be celebrated on a Sunday every year. So here in the States we see Epiphany's date vary from January 2 to January 8. The biggest problem this presents is that the Baptism of the Lord, which is normally celebrated on the Sunday after the Epiphany, would push back the whole liturgical calendar by a week on the years when the Sunday celebration of the Epiphany falls on January 7 or 8, putting the U.S. out of sync with the rest of the Catholic world at least until Lent. To avoid that scenario, the U.S. bishops decreed that in those years the Baptism of the Lord would fall on the Monday after Epiphany, leaving the rest of the calendar intact.

People's Hands

At Mass, people use their hands for a variety of purposes, but there is little legislation governing what to do with them. All the faithful should make the Sign of the Cross with the priest at the beginning. They sign their foreheads, lips, and breast with the deacon or priest just before the Gospel. They may offer some sign of peace. They have the option of receiving Communion in the hand.

The priest follows plenty of instructions. He extends his hands for prayers and greetings, and he outstretches them for solemn blessings. During the Eucharistic Prayer, people may see him raise his hands during the Preface dialogue, impose them over the bread and wine, sign the same elements with the Cross, lift and show the Body and Blood of Christ to the people, make a Sign of the Cross over himself, and elevate the Body and Blood of Christ for the final doxology. The priest breaks bread with his hands and holds a broken host while saying, "Behold, the Lamb of God."

People use their hands for some actions that are not in the rubrics, but are sensible nonetheless. They switch off electronic devices upon entering the church. They hold participation aids to join in the singing and the responses. They place contributions into the collection basket.

Some people improvise other actions. They hold a rosary. They gesture back to the priest when he gestures to them. They join hands with others and raise them together. They sign themselves with the cross for the final blessing.

People's most common gesture associated with prayer-folding handsis never explicitly mentioned in the rubrics of the Mass. However, in the interests of popular piety, it is a praiseworthy practice. Especially when the words people say or hear are directed to God, they may fold their hands in a way that signals to the individual, to other worshipers, and to God, that a moment has arrived to pray.




