Weekly Reflection

Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time | July 26

A SHARE IN GOD'S KINGDOM

Today concludes a three-week series of Gospel texts in which we have listened to a total of seven parables about the Kingdom. The believer is asked to consider the request that God made of Solomon in today's first reading: "Ask something of me and I will give it to you" (1 Kings 3:5). Today's parables about the treasure buried in the field and the pearl of great price should prompt us to answer, "A share in your kingdom, O God!" Today we discover that the kingdom of God is beyond value, a priceless treasure. Unfortunately, our culture bombards us with things that it believes are priceless treasures—the bigger and better SUVs, anti-aging and anti-balding creams and salves, miracle diets, and so much more. Having a share in God's kingdom and helping to bring about that kingdom are the greatest treasures that we can ever hope to gain.

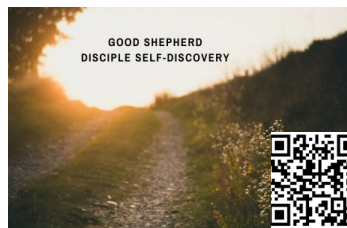

Vocations Corner

29. The brothers and sisters are to love the Lord with their whole heart, their whole soul and mind and with all their strength and to love their neighbor as themselves. Let them glorify the Lord in all they do. For He has sent them into the world so that they might give witness by word and work to His voice and to make known to all that the Lord alone is God. (Mk 12:30, Mt 22:30)

30. As they announce peace with their lips, let them be careful to have it even more within their own hearts. No one should be roused to wrath or insult on their account, rather all should be moved to peace, goodwill and mercy because of their gentleness. The sisters and brothers are called to heal the wounded, to bind up those who are bruised, and to reclaim the erring. Wherever they are they should recall that they have given themselves up completely and handed themselves over totally to Our Lord Jesus Christ. Therefore, they should be prepared to expose themselves to every enemy, visible and invisible for love of him because the Lord says: Blessed are they who suffer persecution for the sake of justice, theirs is the kingdom of heaven (Mt 5:10).

31. In that love which is God (1 Jn. 4:6) all the brothers and sisters, whether they are engaged in prayer, or in announcing the Word of God, or in serving or doing manual labor should strive to be humble in everything. They should not seek glory, or be self-satisfied, or interiorly proud because of a good work or word God does or speaks in or through them. Rather in every place and circumstance let them acknowledge that all good belongs to the most high Lord and Ruler of all things. Let them always give thanks to Him from whom we receive all good.

32. Let the sisters and brothers always be mindful that they should desire one thing alone, namely, the Spirit of God at work within them. Always obedient to the Church and firmly established in the Catholic faith let them live according to the poverty, the humility and the holy Gospel of Our Lord Jesus Christ which they have solemnly promised to observe.

Whoever will observe these things shall be filled with the blessings of the Most High Father in Heaven, and on earth with the blessing of His beloved Son, with the Holy Spirit, and with all virtues and with all the saints.

And I, Brother Francis, your little one and servant, in so far as I am able, confirm to you within and without this most Holy Blessing.

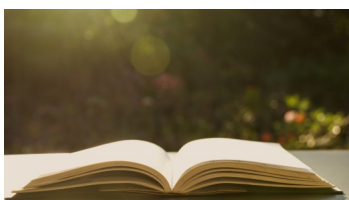

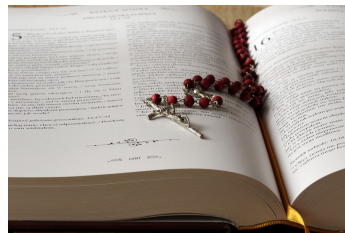

Statement of Faith: Taylor Cowan



My faith comes from the realization that we draw on morality not through abstract thinking, but from the very person of God. That is, it was not reasoning alone that was supreme - it was moral reasoning that could only come from a higher authority.

In a way, the positive things in life are not what brought me back. It was the negative things. It was the negative things because it evidences our knowledge of absolute morality. That is, seeing the immorality and suffering in the world brought me back to God. The question "Why did God allow this to happen?" ultimately rests on the belief that there is moral/absolute right and wrong.

Those questions are evidence of God because those very questions are irrational when there isn't an anchor in an absolute moral right and wrong.

I believe in the Christian religion since it is an uneven exchange. Salvation is priceless. It is supernatural. I can only come to the conclusion that a religion that believes you are entitled to something like salvation, and that it is obtainable with the meager things we have to offer, must be something man made and not the truth. Unlike the other religions, you cannot earn your way to being saved. We are saved without any merit or worthiness in us, without any work that we have done and without any preparation on our part.

If You Are Pro-Life, You Vote Pro-Life

Following are excerpts from his brochure "Why Vote Pro-Life?"

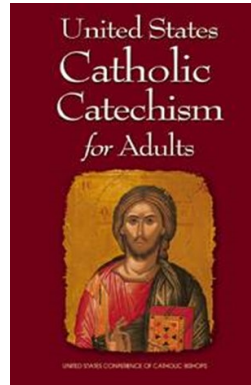
What is Intrinsic Evil? Intrinsic evil is something which is always evil, no matter the circumstances or rationale. If an act is intrinsically evil, it cannot be justified by the intention or by the circumstances (the environment, social pressure, emergency, etc). It is always evil!

As Catholics we are not single-issue voters. A candidate's position on a single issue is not sufficient to guarantee a voter's support. Yet a candidate's support on a single issue that involves an intrinsic evil, such as support for legal abortion or the promotion of racism, may legitimately lead a voter to disqualify a candidate from receiving support.

Two Bishops in Texas, Bishop Kevin Farrell and Bishop Kevin Vann, wrote in 2008, "As Catholics we are faced with a number of issues that are of concern and should be addressed, such as immigration reform, healthcare, the economy and its solvency, care and concern for the poor and the war on terror.....**But let us be clear: issues of prudential judgment are not morally equivalent to issues involving intrinsic evils. No matter how right a given candidate is on any of these issues, it does not outweigh a candidate's unacceptable position in favor of an intrinsic evil such as abortion or the protection of "abortion rights."**

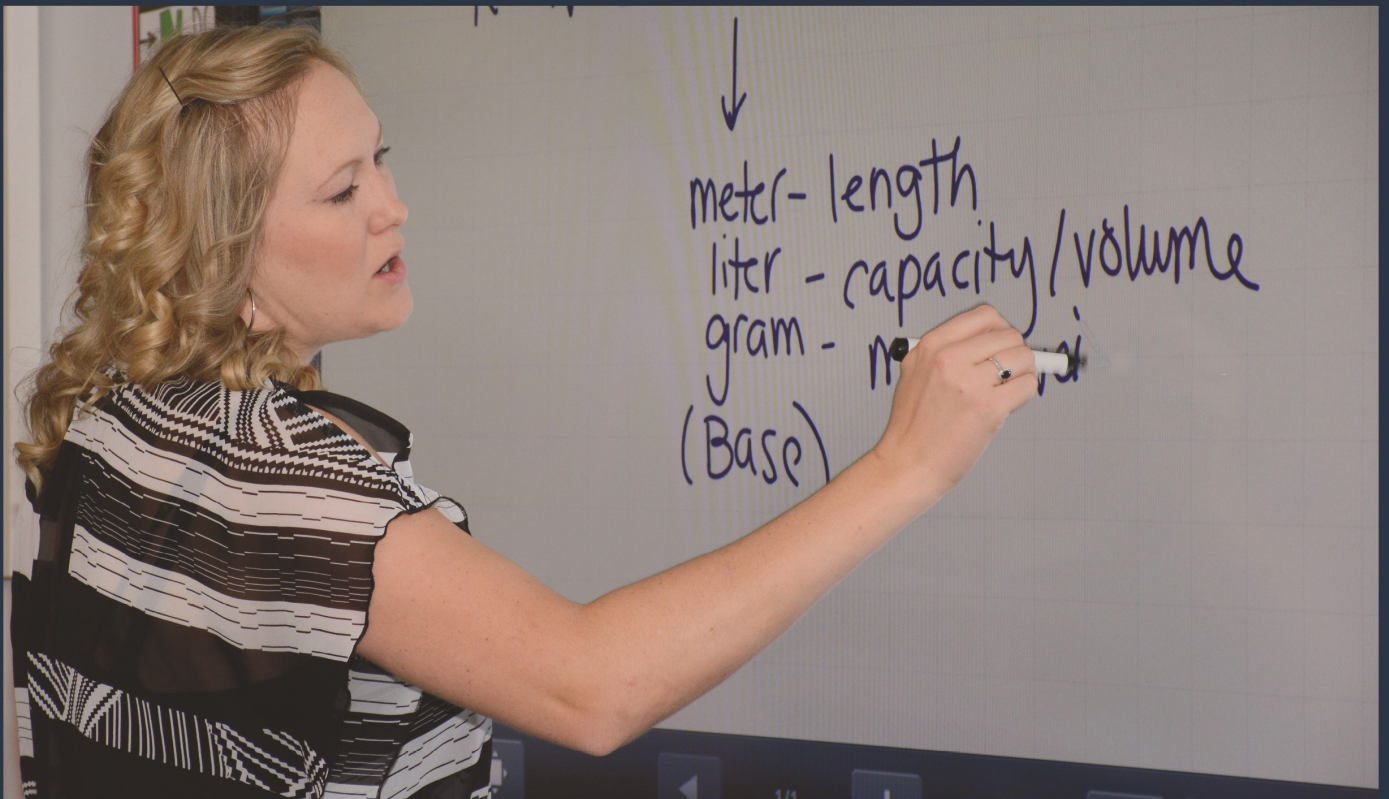
