### **Weekly Reflection**

### Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time | August 2



OUR DEEPEST NEEDS The word of God serves up a tremendous feast for us today. Isaiah beckons all who hunger and thirst to come to the Lord for satisfaction. The psalmist cries out, "The hand of the Lord feeds us; he answers all our

needs" (Psalm 145:16). Saint Paul tells us that nothing can separate us from the love of God. Finally, in the Gospel, we hear the story of the miraculous feeding of over five thousand people from a mere five loaves and two fish. Most of us have our material needs met on a day-to-day basis. These scriptures, nevertheless, have much to say to the contemporary believer. We must ask ourselves, "Where are my deepest hungers? Where are my thirsts?" After material needs are satisfied and, in some cases, over-satisfied, many people still experience a deep longing for spiritual balance and well-being. As the loaves and fish are multiplied in today's Gospel, perhaps our prayer can be a longing for the satisfaction of the deepest needs that only God can fill. Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co.

### Welcome Fr. Michael Higgins!



Peace be with you all!

As I take on the role as Pastor of Good Shepherd Catholic Community, I would like to take some time to introduce myself to you, the parishioners of this great parish. I was born in Boston, Massachusetts, and grew up in a Navy family along with my four brothers. My Dad served in the Navy for over 30 years and retired after his service at Brunswick Naval Air Station in Maine.

Two weeks after my High School graduation I entered the US Army. After service as a radar repairman in Vietnam and my undergraduate work at Framingham State University in Massachusetts, I entered the Province of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus of the Third Order Regular of St. Francis in 1978 in Loretto, PA. I received a Master of Divinity (M.Div.) degree from St. Michael's College, a Master of Sacred Theology (S.T.M.) from Regis College, both member schools of the University of Toronto, and a Master of Arts (M.A.) in formative spirituality from Duquesne University in Pittsburgh, PA. My ordination to the priesthood in 1985 was followed by service in higher education at the Franciscan University of Steubenville, Ohio, Saint Francis University in Loretto, PA, and St. Bonaventure University in Olean, NY. During this time, I was also involved in religious formation for both friars and secular members of the Franciscan family and served

as the Director of Novices for the Third Order Regular friars in the US for eight years.

In 1999 I received a Doctor of Sacred Theology (S.Th.D.) with a specialization in Franciscan spirituality from the Antonianum in Rome. This was later complemented in 2007 by a Ph.D. in Higher Education Administration through Capella University. From 2001 to 2007 I served in Rome as Vicar General of the Third Order Regular of St. Francis and as the General Spiritual Assistant for the Secular Franciscan Order and was elected to a six-year term as Minister General of my Order in 2007.

Upon my return to the United States I was able to enjoy a one-year sabbatical at the Franciscan School of Theology in Oceanside, CA. In 2014, I served the school as a Special Assistant to the President and Dean and assumed the position of Vice President for Academic Affairs in 2015. In August of 2016 I was appointed the eighth President of the school.

In January of this year I accepted the request of my Minister Provincial, Fr. Joseph Lehman, to assist Good Shepherd Catholic Community during a time of transition and its search for a new pastor after the death of Fr. Richard Eldredge. The plan for me was to stay in Colleyville until the end of June - and the choice of a new pastor - and then be assigned to Saint Francis University in Loretto, PA.

During a number of discussions with Fr. Joseph in April and May I agreed to be considered for the position of pastor of Good Shepherd Catholic Community. I was able to discuss this possibility with Bishop Michael Olson in early June. The Bishop expressed his love and concern for Good Shepherd and his hope to locate a pastor for the parish. After this discussion I informed the Bishop that I would accept the position of pastor if he thought that I was a suitable candidate. We also both agreed that Fr. John Mark was doing an exceptional job as the administer of the parish during Fr. Richard's illness and the aftermath of his death.

Bishop Olson has appointed me the Pastor of Good Shepherd Catholic Community effective August 1, 2020. I am pleased to report that Fr. John Mark has agreed to stay with us as Parochial Vicar. Fr. Ron will continue his ministry at Good Shepherd and our newly ordained friar, Fr. Zach, has been assigned to the parish as well. At least for the foreseeable future the parish will be served by a fraternity of four friars.

I am happy to embrace the five characteristics of discipleship that form the core of the mission of Good Shepherd Catholic Community: welcome, encounter, grow, serve, and share as we together seek "to empower all people to develop a deeper relationship with Jesus Christ and to live out our Catholic calling of discipleship and evangelization." To do this I believe that it is essential that we all grow in our personal relationship with our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, and be willing to put our time, talents, and treasure in service to the upbuilding of His kingdom.

As I take on this important position at Good Shepherd, I turn to you for your prayers and support. Believe me, I know that I cannot do this on my own. The parish is blessed to have a wonderful staff who are dedicated to the mission of the church and a wide variety of active ministries and support groups. It is also enriched by its sponsorship of Holy Trinity Catholic School, a vibrant school that is staffed by a faithful and professional staff and faculty.

Together let us continue to closely follow our Good Shepherd and spread the good news of His love, forgiveness, and compassion.



### Statement of Faith: Lorie Laramore



I was seven years old when my spirit first heard and recognized my Heavenly Father's voice. I am not a person who has lived their whole life with no knowledge or belief in God. Quite the contrary. I cannot remember a time in my life that I have ever doubted the Presence of the Lord. I have heard, seen, and felt His Presence every single day of my life. At times, in very dramatic and unexplainable ways. Like that beautiful summer day, at the age of 7, when my soul was first undeniably introduced to His Presence, and I watched rain fall, from a cloudless sunny sky.

I was baptized that same summer into the Baptist faith and would continue to practice that faith until around the age of 30. However, those years were filled with spiritual unrest for me. No matter how many Bible courses I took, hours in church service I attended, or questions I asked, my soul could simply not be at peace with the Baptist beliefs. And finally, upon being informed that my daughter Sarah, who was born with Down's Syndrome, would not be baptized into the church...based on the church's belief that it was not necessary for Sarah to be baptized because her soul is "protected"....I could no longer ignore my conscience and broke with the Baptist church.

I spent the next 20+ years "church shopping" and did attend for some time a Lutheran church. But I was unable to find a permanent "church home" that I was completely spiritually at peace with. And so, I did mostly personal and private worship and study.

Then one day in March of last year, after relocating back to this area from seven years in Corpus Christi, my very dear friend Shawn invited me to attend Mass with her at GSCC. It was then that I realized I had absolutely no real experience or knowledge of the Catholic Faith, and I was a bit anxious about going. However, at that time, my desire to attend ANY church service was so great, that I immediately agreed to join her. That decision put into motion my inquiry and enrollment into RCIA, which has taken me on an amazing journey through the history and practices of the Catholic Church, and brought me to a place of spiritual peace. I look so forward to confirmation and to be in full communion with the Church. I feel so very blessed and cannot wait to continue my RCIA sessions and discover my place of service within our GSCC family.


THE JOY OF LIFE REVEALED


