

## **Weekly Reflection**

#### Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time | August 9



THE PRESENCE OF GOD

After the miracle of Jesus walking on water, the disciples exclaimed, "Truly, you are the Son of God" (Matthew 14:33). Most Christians will probably never experience such a

dramatic miracle. Like Elijah, we await the manifestation of God in other moments. Perhaps the biggest challenge for the believer is to be constantly attuned to the possible presence of God in the everyday events of life. This is a stance that takes some people years to develop. Others seem to find the Lord easily in the simple things. As the week unfolds, let us look for the presence of God in the little things around us. Perhaps, like Elijah, we will be surprised at what we find. And, like the disciples, we can add our voice to the confession, "Truly you are the Son of God."

## **Reminder for In-Person Masses and Covid-19 Precautions**

As you are aware, COVID-19 has become much more widespread in the recent days and weeks. In an effort to continue to maintain a safe campus at Good Shepherd Catholic Community, we are asking all those who come to the church to please review the information below.

## **PROTECT YOURSELF and THOSE AROUND YOU**

- Wash your hands often
- Avoid close contact. Put 6 feet of distance between yourself and people who don't live in your household.
- Cover your mouth and nose with a mask or face covering. According to the CDC, face shields are not recommended, as it is to be a "splash guard" and does not directly cover the mouth and nose.
- Cover coughs and sneezes
- Clean and disinfect frequently
- Monitor your health.

SYMPTOM CHECK – Stay home if you are experiencing any of the following symptoms!

- Fever or chills
- Cough
- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- Fatigue
- Muscle or body aches
- Headache
- New loss of taste or smell
- Sore throat
- Congestion or runny nose
- Nausea or vomiting
- Diarrhea

## QUARANTINE - Stay home if you might have been exposed to COVID-19

Quarantine is used to keep someone who might have been exposed to COVID-19 away from others. Quarantine helps prevent spread of disease that can occur before a person knows they are sick or if they are infected with the virus without feeling symptoms. People in quarantine should stay home, separate themselves from others, monitor their health, and follow directions from their state or local health department.

Anyone who has been in close contact with someone who has COVID-19 should quarantine. What counts as close contact?

- 1. You were within 6 feet of someone who has COVID-19 for at least 15 minutes
- 2. You provided care at home to someone who is sick with COVID-19
- 3. You had direct physical contact with the person
- 4. You shared eating or drinking utensils
- 5. They sneezed, coughed, or somehow got respiratory droplets on you

STAY HOME and monitor your health

Stay home for 14 days after your last contact with a person who has COVID-19

If possible, stay away from others, especially people who are at higher risk for getting very sick from COVID -19

All of the above information can be found on the website of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). Good Shepherd Catholic Community is unable to manage who should or should not be on campus during this pandemic. We are asking all parish staff, liturgical disciples, pastoral musicians, and members of the congregation to please be aware of their own daily health situation. We ask that you do a self-health screen before coming to the Church and to stay home if you are exhibiting any of the symptoms outlined above.

If you or your household have been exposed to COVID-19 you should not work, volunteer, or attend liturgical services at Good Shepherd Catholic Community for 14 days since your last contact with the person who has COVID-19.




"[W]hen a couple is unable to have children, it causes great pain emotionally, intellectually, physically,

Doctors, procedures, the time, the cost, the hope, and the hurt are constant companions on the lonely road walked by couples searching for the destination of parenthood."
