RCIA Candidate - Chelsea Galloway Statement of Faith

I was born on an Air Force military base in New Mexico to my mother, a Baptist. My father, also a Baptist, was a Marine located in California at the time. However, he was not a part of my life until I was five. At that time, he and my mother resumed their relationship and we moved to Texas. From that point, I attended St. John Baptist Church and was active in many ministries throughout childhood and until the end of high school. As is the tradition in the Baptist Church, we do not get baptized until we can understand its meaning and what Jesus Christ did for us during his Passion, Crucifixion, and Resurrection. Most of my peers had completed their Baptism by the time they were seven or eight. I wrestled with it until I was

I remember how intense of a calling I felt to give my life to the Lord on that day of the Altar Call. I had resolved to not sin any more after being baptized. However, as time progressed, my sinful ways returned, and I was at a loss as to what to do about it. In the Baptist Church, I only remember if we sinned, we were told to ask God for forgiveness and to just stop doing it. It seemed like that was not enough; like I was missing something. Thus, one of the many things I found encouraging is that the Catholic Church does have a way to atone for sins, the Rite of Reconciliation. I also found out there are many tools that I can use when needing help with living the life I desire. Tools such as asking for Intercessory Prayer from the Saints, or even talking with my spiritual guide and Sponsor, Cindy Rodgers, who has been a blessing along this journey. Ultimately, my prayer life with the Lord has improved, in both frequency and in depth. I praise Jesus every Sunday at mass, and I understand that the host and the wine are truly the Body and Blood of Christ that gives everlasting life. I feel that as I have matured in age, I am finally able to mature in my faith. God has renewed my understanding through the Catholic Church and for that, I am forever grateful.

July 28, August 11 & 25 7:00pm



Burritos Are Back! June 27 After the 9:00am & 11:00am Masses


